



THOUSANDS PARTICIPATE IN CENTURY CITY SPORTS FESTIVAL

Thousands of runners, cyclists, canoeists, dragon boat racers, soccer and rugby players as well as spectators participated in the third annual Century City Sports Festival which took place from March 4 - 6.

The signature event of the action-packed, three-day Sports Festival was the 10km Century City Championship Road Race on Saturday, March 5 with more than 1200 runners of all ages participating. This annual event, for which there are fantastic prizes and where the first 1000 runners home all receive medals, is becoming an increasingly important fixture on the Western Province Athletics Calendar.

The race follows a safe, flat, circular route in and around Century City providing an ideal opportunity for runners to achieve their personal best times. First home was Lukhanyo Mabinza (Transnet) in a time of 29 minutes 44 seconds followed by Zolani Ntongana (Mr Price WP) and Gert Thys (temporary licence) in third position.

The first woman runner home was Zintle Xiniwe (Nedbank WP) in a time of 35 minutes 27 seconds followed by Belelwa Sima (Nedbank WP) and Nomvuyesi Seti (Celtic).

The first Masters runner over 50 years was Vladimir Kotov, Century City's brand ambassador and a founder member of the Century City Athletic Club, who finished in 32 minutes 58 seconds.

The festival also included a Family Fun Run/Walk, Junior and Senior Touch Rugby tournaments, Dragon Boat racing, five-a-side Soccer tournament, Kermesse Circuit Cycling, Canoeing and Canoe Polo. (See the last page for additional festival results).

Just under 100 cyclists took part in the Kermesse Circuit Cycling with the current South African road champion, Darren Lill, winning the Elite category while three of South Africa's top paddlers - Patrick Birkett, Zaran Courtney and Gavin White, all members of the South African national sprint team - were among the 80 entrants participating in the Canoe Challenge.

Chris Blackshaw, CEO of the Century City Property Owners' Association which organized the festival, said they were delighted with the turnout over the weekend.

"We were honoured to have our 10km road race recognized as the official 10km WP Championship run for 2011. This, plus the flat scenic route, contributed to the record turnout. However, the festival is not just about competition and winning, it is also an immensely popular social event with families turning out en masse to support participants and join in the festivities."

Blackshaw thanked this year's main sponsors Coca Cola, Powerade, Ratanga Junction and Canal Walk for their support.

"We aim to continue growing the Sports Festival each year and additional sponsors are now being sought to ensure the 2012 Century City Festival is even bigger and better," he said.

ENROLMENT NOW OPEN FOR NEW DAY CARE CENTRE

Enrolment has opened for a new 620m² crèche, due to come on stream in Central Park, Century City in the third quarter of this year.

The new building for the Endeavour Educare Centre, which has outgrown its current premises, is being built to accommodate the strong demand for day care and pre-school facilities in the precinct.

Endeavour Educare Centre first opened in October 2008 operating from premises below the Century City Property Owners' Association (CCPOA) offices in Central Park but for the past year or so it has been fully subscribed and has a long waiting list.

The new single storey building will enable Endeavour Educare to triple its enrolment to around 180 children while its current smaller premises will be converted into a Grade R facility, which is sorely needed in the area, from January 2012.

The new crèche is expected to be ready for occupation in August/September this year. Endeavour Educare Centre operates on weekdays from 7am to 5.30pm.

Each of the seven classrooms (averaging 50m² each) in the new premises, will be able to accommodate around 25 children. Each class will

have a qualified educare teacher, as well as a teacher's assistant. The facility also sports a spacious 110m² multipurpose hall, and a large, secure and private grassed play area.

Endeavour Educare is a branch of the family operated business SHUTTLE KIDZ, which is owned by Leslee and Brian Gale while their son, Adam, heads up Endeavour Educare Centre in Century City.

Leslee said they had received overwhelming support. "We're so excited about the new premises which will assist us in meeting the pent up demand for quality educare in the precinct.
